Miscellaneous Programs and Provisions of Interest

- Provides a 4.6% DoD Military & Civilian Personnel Pay Raise
- Provides \$352 million, an increase of \$10 million from the requested amount, for the <u>Cooperative</u> <u>Threat Reduction program</u>
- Provides \$20 million for research into low enriched uranium for use in naval reactors (NNSA's Nonproliferation Fuels Development account)
- Restricts the use of funds to reduce or prepare to reduce the number of deployed and non-deployed strategic delivery vehicles and launchers (Sec. 8014)
- Prohibits funding from being obligated or expended for assistance to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea unless specifically appropriated for that purpose or for POW/MIA activities (Sec. 8049)
- Prohibits funding from being used in contravention of the War Powers Resolution (<u>Sec. 8114</u>)
- Prohibits the use of funds with respect to Iraq or Syria in contravention of the War Powers Resolution (Sec. 8131-8132)
- Provides that nothing in this Act may be construed as authorizing the use of force against Iran or North Korea (Sec. 8133)
- Prohibits the use of funds to close Guantanamo Bay detention facility or to transfer detainees to the United States (Sec. 8140-8142)
- Directs NNSA to provide to Congress a plan to establish a two-site Integrated Master Schedule covering the entirety of the work required to produce 80 pits per year within 180 days after enactment (Energy and Water Report)
- Directs the Missile Defense Agency to provide quarterly updates to the congressional defense committees on the status of the Homeland Defense Radar - Hawaii production and location siting, as well as current and evolving threats in the region at the unclassified and classified level (<u>Defense</u> <u>Report</u>)
